No Tolls On the GG Bridge

If you read CityBike's December issue, you know about the petition to eliminate tolls for motorcycles on the Golden Gate Bridge. But we need to write letters to be heard.

AMA's Western States Rep., Nick Hatis sent letters to 5,000 Bay Area motorcyclists, urging them to send letters in favor of eliminating bridge tolls for motorcycles. He suggests making the following points:

- The light weight and single-track design of motorcycles cause virtually no wear and tear to infrastructure, so no toll facility maintenance costs can reasonably be attributed to motorcycle use.
- Motorcycles generally weigh between 400-700 pounds, and even with a trailer or sidecar, seldom exceed 1,000 pounds. Motorcycles reduce congestion and are more fuel efficient than other motor vehicles. They average about 50mpg, vs. about 22.5 for automobiles.
- The wheelbase of a motorcycle is about half that of a car, so they take up less space when parked.

So the benefits of motorcycle use should be recognized by the compelte elimination of tolls for motorcycles on the Golden Gate Bridge.


Christmas Ale and Chimay Ale Tasting
